

Tri-City R/C Racers

Tri-City R/C Racers is a non-profit organization created for the purpose of providing an organized and controlled means of staging competitive Radio Controlled races.

The Club is dedicated to the principle of providing such races in a manner which is fair and equitable to all classes of competition.

The Club is further dedicated to providing the newcomer to the hobby the opportunity to develop and demonstrate the racing skill and technical knowledge of the sport required to compete fully and fairly in the classes of his or her choice.

Tri-City R/C Racers is also dedicated to the principle that such competition and opportunity should be provided in an atmosphere conducive to full family participation where honesty, courtesy and professional conduct are the standard at all times.

The Club operates on the premise that the above goals can only be achieved through the co-operative and equal effort of its members and through the application of accepted rules and regulations.

It is therefore a condition of membership in the Tri-City R/C Racers that all members shall abide by the Club's statement of purpose and the rules of racing as approved by the full Membership. Failure to do so may result in cancellation of racing privileges, penalties or forfeiture of membership.

The following rules are designed to imitate full scale racing and insure fair competition. The rules are not designed to control racing, but to establish equal guide lines so everyone will enjoy the hobby and contribute to the growth of RC racing. Race director will classify cars for all events.

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CLUB OPERATIONS

The elected officers and its officials are responsible for administering the rules and regulations with common sense, without personal prejudice and in fairness to all concerned.

The rules and regulations of the Tri-City R/C Racers can be altered or amended only by a vote of the membership. Notice must be given of such a meeting and its intended purpose.

CLUB BOARD

A 3 member board of the Tri-City R/C Racers shall be elected by the members. The Executive will meet at least two times yearly and full membership meetings shall be held at least two times yearly at which time the Executive will hear motions from the membership and put forth its recommendations and reports for approval or discussion by the Members.

KEY MEMBERS

Key members of the Tri-City R/C Racers Club shall be selected by the board members. The key members will be given a key to the track. These members are allowed to open the track for scheduled practice or events. It will be the responsibility of the key member who opens the track to be present for the entire time he/she has chosen and to maintain ALL club rules during such time.

ELECTION OF BOARD & KEY MEMBERS

The present term of office for club board members is one year.

A member must be 18 years old or over to be on the board or to be a key member. ALL members are eligible to vote.

CLUB FINANCE

Complete financial statements will be prepared periodically and made available to all members.

Club checks must carry an authorized signature of a board member and a vote of membership shall be required for any expense in excess of \$200.00

In the event that the Tri-City R/C Racers Club should cease to operate, all assets and monies held after expenses have been paid shall be donated to a Non-Profit Organization chosen by the Tri-City R/C Club members.

No one will be reimbursed for track expenses unless the purchase is authorized by all 3 officers.

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MEMBERSHIP

Memberships are \$50.00 and are sold on an annual basis with expiry on January 1st of the following year.

The following adjustments occur at years end to encourage new members to not withhold membership because of the shorter time span:

January 1 - August 31	50.00
September 1 – September 30	40.00
October 1 – October 31	30.00
November 1 – November 30	20.00
December 1 – December 31	10.00

All members are expected to work two to four hours a month at the track to help with the maintenance of the track and surrounding areas.

Members children 15 and under are included in their membership.

Conditions of the membership are further defined in the track rules.

RACING FEES

Racing fee structure may be changed to meet the financial requirements of the Club.
